Position: Academic Intervention Specialist

Academic year (late September- early June), part-time, hourly employment (12.5 **Hours:**

Description: The VLP is looking for a committed individual who wants to increase their experience in building relationships with urban youth and their families in out-ofschool-time programming. LINK (Let's Invest in Neighborhood Kids) After School is a free program that seeks to provide academic support and character education in a fun and safe environment.

> The Academic Intervention Specialist is responsible for boosting student academic progress in our LINK After School programs through small group intervention and family communication.

Responsibilities: Under the direction of the Youth Programs Coordinator, performs the following functions:

Programming

- Uses restorative practices to build strong relationships to and between students and community members
- Implements academic intervention strategies in small groups for LINK participants
- Regularly assesses students receiving intervention services
- Communicates with families regularly about the progress and suggested support activities for students receiving academic intervention services
- Provides opportunities for family involvement by partnering with them in understanding their child's academic assessment
- Acts as an instructional planning resource for Academic Teachers
- Commits to evidence-based, data-driven, and goal-oriented programming

Post-offer background check & fingerprinting required.

- Uses innovation and creativity in youth development work to result in academic progress
- Takes a case management approach in assessing and meeting students' academic and social needs
- Involvement with partner school teaching community and students' school day activities
- Actively utilizes the VLP library, its staff, and its services
- Models positive relationships between youth and co-workers
- Performs other related duties as assigned

Reporting

- Maintains and reports accurate student data as required by the program
- Participates actively in student and family surveys and assessments
- Assists in evaluating program for its effectiveness by providing regular input to aid in its success

Community Outreach

- Acts as a liaison between VLP, local schools, parents, and young patrons to support youths' academic achievements
- Provides a high level of customer service to parents, partners, library patrons, and the general public

Staff Collaboration

- Works as part of a team to achieve the VLP's Mission and to integrate the VLP's Core Principles in all efforts
- Required attendance and staffing of major VLP "all staff" events and "LINK Program Staff" events
- Attends VLP staff meetings and meets with supervisor regularly
- Addresses email requests and phone messages in a timely manner
- Opens and closes library and 2510 building using proper security procedures
